Sharing Memories

Exwick Local History group was really pleased to meet Margaret (95) who was born and grew up in Exwick. Margaret came to several meetings and shared her memories of growing up in Exwick. It was fascinating hearing about her experiences as a young girl during the Second World War. She told us about the lives of her parents and grandparents and remembered the old wash house and the farms: "We would go to the farm with a jug and buy milk."

Margaret's mother's family, the de Viells, had lived on Exwick Hill since the 1840s — the work they did over the years helps build a picture of Exwick in the past: paper maker, wool sorter, agricultural labourer, stone mason, dress maker, railway labourer, laundress, gardener.

We were able to help scan and label Margaret's old photos and we provided the family with information from census returns, newspaper archives and other historic records.

A big thank you to Margaret for sharing her memories and making history come alive.

Update from Felix - CPAO

Walking Basketball is for Everyone!

We are excited to have launched the city's first ever Walking Basketball group this month. Based on the initial idea, which came from two St Thomas residents, we started to look for suitable venues and found that there are limited indoor basketball facilities available. but that there seems to be a lot of interest from local people. After further research and planning, we managed to run a trial session in October and started a conversation with the Exeter Spartans Basketball Club to join forces. Under the banner of the Spartans, we are now running weekly Sunday sessions from 7-8pm at the Exeter College Sports Hall at Victoria Yard, just off Queen Street. This central location will hopefully make the sessions suitable for lots of people from across Exeter.

Walking Basketball is very similar to regular basketball but involves no physical contact and no running. The group is all about inclusivity and we invite people of all ages (18+) and abilities to come and join us for non-competitive, friendly games. It's all about having fun. One of the people who took part in our recent trial shared that he wanted "to be involved in some casual/inclusive basketball" and that he'd "mostly stopped playing competitively", feeling frustrated as his "body won't do the things it used to do". Having taken part in the trial, he said that it was "nice to come away from a session feeling positive."

We will start on a pay and play basis with £3 per session, but the first session is free! If this has sparked your interest, join our Walking Basketball Facebook group for more information.


Walking Tennis is coming to Exwick!


Following a brilliant Walking Tennis taster session as part of the recent Exwick Walking Sports

The new sessions will be the first time Walking Tennis will be played on a regular basis in Exeter. The sport is currently gaining a lot of attention as it's all about inclusivity, with rules adapted to suit all abilities and ages. Rules include no running and jumping, balls being allowed to bounce twice, playing on smaller courts as well as using lighter balls. The sessions will focus on being fun and friendly, and we encourage anyone (18+) interested to come along and give it a go!




